RE: Noise Restrictions Exception – Nazareth Academy Night Football Games

GENERAL BACKGROUND

In 2015, Nazareth Academy was granted a variance from the Village Board to install permanent lights on the existing football. The purpose of the lights was to allow for evening practices and sporting events. The Village Board's approval of the variation for the lights was conditioned upon several items, including a restriction to five night football games per year and the requirement to obtain an exception from the Village's nuisance regulations in order to operate their sound system past 9:00 p.m. during the night football games. In accordance with the zoning approval, Nazareth Academy has submitted a Temporary Use Permit Application requesting an exception to the nuisance regulations regarding noise for the following night football games:

Friday, September 18, 2020
Friday, September 25, 2020
Friday, October 9, 2020
Friday, October 16, 2020
Friday, October 23, 2020

The games will begin at 7:00 p.m. and are anticipated to conclude by 10:00 p.m. Village staff may approve the event as a Permitted Temporary Use in accordance with Section 153.195 of the Village Municipal Code, but cannot approve the event to operate past 9:00 p.m. due to Village nuisance restrictions. Section 93.04.C.5 of the Village Municipal Code classifies "all loud and discordant noises or vibrations of any kind between 9:00 p.m. and 7:00 a.m.," as a nuisance, affecting peace and safety.

The Municipal Code permits the Village Board to approve an exception to the nuisance restrictions for Temporary Uses. As such, should the Village Board approve an exception to nuisance restrictions specific to the identified dates, Village staff will approve their Temporary Use Application.

RECOMMENDATION

Staff recommends the Village Board grant a specific exception to Village noise restrictions, in accordance with their authority as contained in Section 93.04.C.5 of the Municipal Code.

RE: Butterfly Garden Grant through ComEd Green Region Program

PURPOSE: To request approval to accept the ComEd Green Region grant in order to construct multiple butterfly gardens in the Village of La Grange Park.

GENERAL BACKGROUND:

La Grange Park has been awarded this grant after applying in February of 2020. This is a fantastic opportunity to help diminishing pollinator populations and to improve Village owned green spaces. Not only do we plan to beautify our Village, but we also look to build community awareness, support, and involvement with education resources and participation with construction. With this project, ComEd, will provide the village with an award and media coverage to showcase the project. We have been awarded \$2,500 and will be required to match the awarded funds. This will give the village a total of \$5,000 for the project budget which will not begin until spring of 2021. The matching \$2,500 will be added to the Public Works budget for fiscal year 2021-22 and completion of the project must occur by March of 2022. This is a great opportunity to help our environment and to make La Grange Park an even more spectacular place to live.

Through the application process I have found numerous community organizations who would like to assist with the creation of these butterfly gardens. Some of these committed groups are The La Grange Park Sustainability Commission, Forest Road Girl Scout Troop #56054, and classes of The Science Center at Barnsdale Road School.

STAFF RECOMMENDATION:

RE: Equipment Purchase – New 2020 Backhoe

PURPOSE

To approve a purchase of a new 2020 Caterpillar 430 Backhoe Loader with accessories.

GENERAL BACKGROUND:

The FY20/21 budget includes finances allocated for the purchase of a new backhoe necessary in services provided by a Public Works Department. The current backhoe is a 1999 John Deere 310 SE, which has served the Public Works Department well over the last 20 years.

A DPW staff committee was convened for the purpose of a demo with both John Deere and Caterpillar backhoes for one week. Staff unanimously determined the Caterpillar machine better suited to the many needs of Public Works maintenance operations. Machine specifications and pricing were reviewed, concluding in a total cost of \$131,580.00 (includes additional Autolube System) from Altorfer Caterpillar Company.

Caterpillar has been in operation for more than 85 years and is considered significant in heavy construction equipment. Packaged in the price are key components including, an extended warranty, a two-year service plan, a breaker, two digging buckets, a quick-release rear coupler, and a 4- way front bucket. Additionally, Altorfer provided a trade-in value of \$18,000 for our current John Deere backhoe.

Staff notes further items essential for a complete build-out but not included in the overall price from Altorfer is a two-way radio installation (\$200.00) and decals (\$525.00), which will be installed after the new machine is delivered.

Sourcewell was previously approved by Village Attorney Keating for large purchases, La Grange Park became a member of Sourcewell in 2020, a national cooperative bidding firm.

The Village has budgeted \$160,000.00 in the Water Fund – Capital Outlay (04-44-4-400) for this purchase.

STAFF RECOMMENDATION:

Staff recommends the Village Board accept Quote # 120393-03 from Altorfer Caterpillar in the amount of \$131,580.00 for a new Caterpillar 430 Backhoe.


