## President's Corner

Summer is finally here and as in past years, it promises to be an eventful one. At the forefront of our priorities is the continued implementation of the road improvement program and a continued focus on economic development and financial sustainability.

In April, construction began on Phase Three of the Road Paving Program. Over \$3 million of paving will be completed by November. For the complete list of the streets to be resurfaced this year please see page 4. While it is exciting to again have such a significant amount of road construction underway, it may also pose some challenges to residents while traveling through town. We ask that residents be extra cautious when driving through and around construction areas.

In 2017, the Village established two Tax Increment Financing Districts (TIF's) and four Business Development Districts (BDD's) as part of the Village Board's long term strategy to ensure the financial sustainability of the Village. We are pleased to announce that Posto 31, a new restaurant located at 1017 E. 31st Street, is the first recipient of funding through the Village's 31st Street/Barnsdale TIF and BDD programs. The Village worked closely with the business throughout the planning, development and construction phases of the project. The Village is also pleased to welcome Crown Trophy to the community (19 E. 31st Street) and the Dollar Tree (Village Market). Both businesses opened their doors in May. With each new business that locates in La Grange Park, our community becomes stronger and our financial sustainability improves. One of my favorite parts about living in La Grange Park are the many ways in which our community comes together. ## Home Fire Sprinkler Systems and Alarms

As you may be aware, all homes constructed in La Grange Park since August of 2003 have been required to be protected by fire sprinklers. There are now nearly 80 homes located in La Grange Park that are equipped with residential fire sprinkler systems.

Residential fire sprinkler systems are designed to control fires inside the living areas of the home until the fire department arrives, allowing for occupants to safely escape. Most times, the fire sprinklers will actually extinguish the fire prior to the fire department's arrival, potentially saving lives, and saving thousands of dollars in smoke and fire damage.

Fires that activate the fire sprinkler system will sound bells inside the home, and may also be interconnected to the home's security system to notify the fire department. In addition, a small horn and strobe light is located on the exterior of the home, to draw the attention of other nearby residents and those passing by should a fire occur when no one is home. Contractors try to place the device in a location so it is aesthetically pleasing, but can still be seen from the street. Many times if you look closely at a new home, you can see the device on or near the front of the home.

Should you ever notice a horn and/or strobe activating, and the home is near completion or already has residents living there, please dial 911 to report it; you can potentially help save someone or their home.

# Lawn Care

## Have A Lawn Irrigation System? Your Backflow Devices Must Be Tested

Lawn sprinkler systems will be starting up soon. Plumbing Code and state regulations require that backflow preventers be tested annually and/or when a backflow preventer is relocated or re-installed every season. The water customer must contract with a licensed tester to perform the required annual tests and any necessary repairs. Most plumbing contractors are certified to test backflow preventers. Note there are costs associated with testing and maintaining backflow devices.

Federal, state and local regulations require every municipal water supplier to develop, implement, and maintain a comprehensive Cross Connection Control (CCC) program designed to safeguard the public water supply. Cross connections are sometimes protected by a valve called a backflow preventer. Backflow preventers are the property of the water customer and the responsibility lies with the customer for required annual testing and maintenance.

Residential backflow preventers may be found on lawn irrigation systems, wet fire protection systems, hot water heating (boiler) systems, swimming pool fills, water features, etc. Backflow preventers may also be found or required if there is another water source on the site such as a well, pond, river, etc.

The Village asks for your cooperation with our program, its enforcement, and any requests for information that come from the Village. The Village's CCC program is administered by the Public Works Department. Questions may be directed to Wendy Aikens at: waikens@lagrangepark.org or (708) 352-2922.

## Time Is Running Out to Disconnect your Downspout

The deadline to disconnect your gutter downspouts, and also to receive reimbursement from the Village for doing so is fast approaching. Downspouts must be disconnected from the Village's combined sewer system by January of 2019, and our reimbursement program ends this October, in 2018. As such, it is important to act now. # Water Meter Transmitter Replacement Program

The Village has contracted with United Meters Inc. to replace the transmitter which allows the village to read your water meter each quarter. The current equipment is over 15 years old and has begun to fail. The equipment is inside your home adjacent to the water meter. The work typically takes less than half an hour. The contractor will also knock on doors between appointments to see if residents have available time for them to complete the work. All of their employees have an ID with La Grange Park logo on it and they have been screened by our Police Department. They have white pickup trucks with the UMI logo on them. This is the same contractor that replaced the water meters roughly 15 years ago. Your cooperation is appreciated in scheduling an appointment with them. Installation of the replacement equipment is mandatory. The center section of the Village (between La Grange Road and the railroad tracks) will be completed this summer. Other areas of the Village were completed last year.



# Annual Water Quality Report

The Village does test for lead and copper, and all samples have passed those tests. Based on recent lead issues in the news, some residents have expressed a desire to have the water in their home tested independently from the Village's mandated sampling. The Village uses Suburban Laboratories in Oak Brook, Illinois for sampling, and they offer water testing services to homeowners for a fee. # Water & Sewer Rate Increase

In 2017, the Village recently completed a comprehensive analysis of our water and sewer system infrastructure needs and rate structure. The findings of the study demonstrate that our current rate structure cannot support the funding necessary to maintain well-functioning, reliable water and sewer systems. The Village Board recently approved an increase to the water rate from \$7.71 to \$10.00 per 100 cubic feet and the sewer rate from \$2.32 to \$2.75 per 100 cubic feet as recommended in the rate study. The minimum quarterly water and sewer bill based on 600 cubic feet will increase from \$60.18 to \$76.50. The new rates are effective June 1st. Most residential customers are billed quarterly and will not see the full impact of the rate increase on their bill until September, October or November.

## Brush Collection Program

The Village brush collection pick-up occurs on the Monday of the first full week of the month. Brush must be at the curb by 7:00 a.m. A first sweep is conducted through the entire Village, picking up the smaller piles of brush. Larger piles will be left for the end loader and dump truck to pick-up.

If you miss putting your brush out, the yard waste can be packaged for the Village's waste hauler (Republic Services) to pick up. Brush and branches must be securely bundled with bio-degradable twine or rope. Each bundle must be no more than four feet in length, two feet in diameter and weigh no more than fifty pounds. Individual branches must be no larger than three inches in diameter. A yard waste sticker must be affixed to each bundle.

## Fall Leaf Removal Schedule

Residents are advised that the schedule below is only a guideline. Leaves must be raked into the street gutter by 6:00am Monday of the collection week. The Public Work's Department will do its best to adhere to this schedule, however in the event of an emergency, leaf pickup may be delayed. Should the schedule be delayed, every attempt will be made to get back on schedule as quickly as possible. During those times when the schedule is delayed, your patience and understanding are appreciated.

**East:** All streets east of the IHB railroad tracks.

**West:** All streets west of La Grange Road

**Center:** All streets from La Grange Road east to the IHB railroad tracks

## Planning & Zoning Commission Packets Now Online

With the release of the new Village website, the Village has begun posting the full Planning & Zoning Commission meeting packets online. Previously only the agenda was available online. The Planning & Zoning Commission meets the third Tuesday of every month (as needed) to review zoning applications for new development, variations, special uses and more. These meetings are open to the public.

## 2018 Road Paving Program

As a result of the \$10 million bond referenda passed in March of 2016, the Village entered into the third phase of road resurfacing earlier this spring. This year 33 blocks will be resurfaced. Paving will be completed by two contractors; K-FIVE Construction Corporation and Arrow Paving. Construction began in April and is anticipated to be complete in November.

**Contract #1** is for local roads and funded entirely from the bond proceeds. This contract will be completed by K-FIVE Construction.

**Contract #2** was awarded by IDOT and the Village's cost share was 30% of the construction cost. This contract is for Harding from Brainard to Kemman. The work was completed by Arrow Road Construction. As an east-west street the blocks are shorter, so the work completed is equivalent to 8 blocks of north/south streets.

**Contract #3** will be awarded by IDOT in the coming weeks. The low bidder is K-FIVE Construction. The work is a resurfacing of Sherwood from Harding to Homestead then up the hill to La Grange Road. The Village's cost share will be 30% of the construction cost. This work is approximately 4 blocks.

Bond dollars will also fund road patches on those streets not slated for resurfacing in the next few years.

# Village Board Highlights


The Board of Trustees conducted the following business during the months of: March, April, & May:

- Approved the purchase of six sets of new protective gear (pants and coats), at the cost of \$2,059.95 per set, or a total of \$12,359.70, from Dinges Fire Company
- Authorized payment to Lyons-Pinner Electric Company for the purchase and installation of a decorative street light on 31st Street in the amount of \$16,284.80
- Adopted an Ordinance of the Village of La Grange Park, Cook County, Illinois, Correcting a Scrivener's Error in the Legal Description for the Village Market Redevelopment Project Area
- Approved an Ordinance Authorizing the sale of Surplus Property Owned by the Village of La Grange Park
- Approved the Payment of \$10,888.00 to Health Endeavors, SC, of Lombard, IL for this fiscal year's annual Occupational Health Medical Evaluations
- Approved the Payment of \$16,223.55 to the Village of La Grange for our Village's 10% match portion of the 2016 Regional Assistance to Firefighters Grant for New Portable Radios
- Approved an Ordinance Amending Chapter 112 of Title XI of the La Grange Park Municipal Code Regulating Liquor Sales and Licenses
- Approved a Temporary Use Permit for Jewel-Osco, located at 507 E. Woodlawn, to allow for the construction of a 1,560 square foot Temporary Structure for seasonal retail sales; to be occupied on or after April 1, 2018 and to be removed no later than July 15, 2018
- Authorized staff to order the correct chassis with the shorter cab to chassis length from Coffman GMC at a cost of \$39,000 plus \$105 for registration and title and authorize the sale of the incorrect chassis to Bonnell Industries at our purchase price of \$38,501.00
- Affirmed the rescission of the Redevelopment Agreement and withdrew the Village's incentive offer by repealing Ordinance No. 1068, An Ordinance of the Village of La Grange Park, Cook County, Illinois, Approving a Redevelopment Agreement for the Redevelopment of 1015 and 1017 E. 31st Street

**B**urr Ride is a designated Electronics Recycling Collection center. This collection center is located at the Public Works building at 451 Commerce Street. The center is staffed daily from 7:00 a.m. to 3:00 p.m. There is a fee for all televisions and monitors, which can be paid in advance at [recycle.eworksesi.org](http://recycle.eworksesi.org) or you may pay the fee onsite. "Fly dumping" is NOT permitted.

Site will accept the following items: computers, CPUs, monitors, keyboards, televisions, radios, microwaves, laptops, printers, cell phones, UPS systems, PDU's, fax machines, phones, DVD players, VCR's and stereo equipment. These sites will NOT accept any item containing liquids or refrigerants.

### Vehicle Stickers Due July 31st

La Grange Park vehicle stickers must be purchased and displayed prior to midnight on July 31, 2018. Renewal postcards were mailed in early June. Please correct any pre-printed information on your renewal postcard and return it with payment to Village Hall for processing. We encourage you to mail your renewal information and payment as soon as possible to the Village of La Grange Park, 447 N. Catherine Avenue, La Grange Park, IL 60526.

Vehicle stickers are \$35.00. If you are purchasing a new sticker or have not received a renewal postcard, blank applications are available online at [www.lagrangepark.org](http://www.lagrangepark.org) or at Village Hall. Vehicle stickers may be purchased at Village Hall Monday through Friday from 8:30 a.m. to 5:00 p.m. Village Hall will be opened for additional hours on Saturday, July 28th from 10:00 a.m. to 2:00 p.m. to sell stickers. Stickers may also be purchased online.

Seniors who are 65 years of age prior to July 1, 2018 may purchase one sticker at \$15.00. Seniors are limited to one senior rate sticker per household. Please note that senior rate stickers are not available online.

Stickers purchased after midnight July 31, 2018 will include delinquent penalties. Vehicles not properly licensed are in violation of Village Code and may be ticketed by police. Fines are \$50.00 per offense. The fee for the replacement of a lost or damaged sticker is \$5.00.

### Dog Licenses Due July 31st

Dog Licenses are \$10.00. A 50% late fee applies after August 15th.
