As requested for insertion into the Village Board meeting agenda packet, the following is a brief summary of Fire Department activity highlights for the month of August. As usual, a more comprehensive monthly report is kept within the department for your review.

EMS Responses for this month - 152. There have been 1132 YTD compared to 1165 YTD in 2015.  
Fire/Rescue Incidents this month - 43. There have been 314 YTD compared to 337 YTD in 2015.

During the month, staff continued to meet with vendors and assess purchasing options for our ladder truck/quint. Staff visited various other fire departments to evaluate various vehicles from various manufacturers, and a few personnel traveled to the Pierce Manufacturing plant in Appleton, Wisconsin, to tour their plant.

On August 2<sup>nd</sup>, the Fire Department assisted the Police Department at the National Night Out event, with providing Sparky, fire safety educational materials, and static fire apparatus displays.

During the month, as part of our MABAS Division 10 Hazardous Materials Response Team training, a couple of our personnel were provided training by the Illinois National Guard 5<sup>th</sup> Civil Support Team.

The Fire Station One painting project was completed during the month, which included pressure washing the walls and apparatus garage bay ceiling, and then painting the ceiling, various doors, piping, and trim. We should commend those personnel who helped with the project, especially Division Chief Norm Rick, who coordinated most of the project. Our staff did a lot of prep and moving work, including standing by while fire apparatus was parked outside overnight. A couple of personnel also hand-washed all the fluorescent lighting fixtures at the ceiling. This project really helped improve this area of the station, not only in appearance, but by providing a somewhat healthier environment with removing all of the soot and particles that had accumulated on the ceiling, conduit, fixtures and piping over the years.

Aug 1<sup>st</sup> Mon at 10:55 pm: Responded to a gasoline spill at Citgo at 1101 N. La Grange. Firefighters diluted and flushed the spill, checked catch basins with meters for flammability, and contacted MWRD.

Aug 13<sup>th</sup> Sat at 5:39 pm: Responded to a natural gas leak involving a gas meter outside 1525 Harrison. Responding personnel stopped the leak and contacted Nicor.

Aug 19<sup>th</sup> Fri at 5:14 pm: Stood by with an Engine at Westchester while they handled a house fire.

Aug 21<sup>st</sup> Sun at 11:39 pm: Responded with an Engine and Chief to assist Brookfield with a vehicle and garage fire in the 3400 block of Park

Aug 27<sup>th</sup> Sat at 5:40 pm: Responded to a power line down with a small brush fire at 31<sup>st</sup> and Brainard. Stood by for ComEd to cut power, and then extinguished remaining fire.



## EMERGENCY MEDICAL SERVICES ACTIVITY REPORT – AUGUST 2016

### Ambulance Responses:

This month, EMT and Paramedic personnel responded to a total of 152 requests for emergency medical services treating a total of 158 patients. There were 121 calls located west of the IHB Railroad and 16 calls east of the IHB Railroad. Year to date, there has been a total of 1132 requests for service treated 1143 patients.

This compares to last year (August 2015) when there were 148 requests for service with a year to date total of 1165 responses.

### Training and Continuing Education:

EMT continuing education was held on Tuesday, August 9<sup>th</sup> in the Community Room at Fire Station #1. Paramedic continuing education was conducted on Monday, August 15<sup>th</sup>, Wednesday, August 17<sup>th</sup>, and Friday, August 19<sup>th</sup> at the LaGrange Fire Department.

### Special Activities:


Members continued viewing and looking at ambulances and ambulance manufacturers working toward a recommendation to the Village for the purchase of a replacement ambulance in early fall.




