

Re: Fire Department Activities – MAY 2015

As requested for insertion into the Village Board meeting agenda packet, the following is a brief summary of Fire Department activity highlights for the month of May. As usual, a more comprehensive monthly report is kept within the department for your review.

EMS Responses for this month - 176. There have been 712 YTD compared to 634 YTD in 2014.
Fire/Rescue Incidents this month - 46. There have been 192 YTD compared to 249 YTD in 2014.

Fire Department personnel provided EMS coverage for the annual Run for the Roses. Personnel also staffed an engine and ambulance to assist La Grange with covering calls north of the BNSF railroad during the Pet Parade. Also, additional personnel attended the parade with our ladder truck.

Personnel assisted with fire evacuation drills at all schools throughout the month.

During the month, personnel attended the EMS Week Appreciation Breakfast sponsored by Loyola Hospital EMS, where some of our personnel received recognition for resuscitating a resident who was in cardiac arrest.

Personnel attended the Memorial Day service with an engine and ambulance at Memorial Park Wall on May 31st. Personnel provided a fire truck display for a year-end event at Ready Teddy. Personnel also attended five block parties.

Personnel attended the celebration honoring the life and family of Becca Mueller at Forest Rd. School on the evening of May 29th. They participated in a tug-of-war contest against police, school staff and students.

05/04 (MON) 7:28 PM: Responded to extinguish a tree on fire at 29th St. and Harrison Ave. The tree was fairly hollow, so Public Works was contacted to assist in safely managing it by cutting it open to complete extinguishment.

05/11 (THUR) 10:57 AM: Responded to an odor of gas coming from a new gas meter installation at 706 Kemman. The FD investigated and stood by until Nicor arrived.

05/15 (FRI) 6:55 PM: Responded to at 322 Ashland Ave., where the air conditioner electrical disconnect box was on fire, which was located on the back of the house.

05/20 (WED) 7:48 PM: Responded with an engine and chief to assist the La Grange Fire Department with a house fire at 345 S. Spring.

05/23 (SAT) 2:58 PM: Responded to 615 N. La Grange Rd. for garbage cans that were on fire next to a garage, and which also damaged a fence.



EMERGENCY MEDICAL SERVICES ACTIVITY REPORT – MAY 2015

Ambulance Responses:

This month, EMT and Paramedic personnel responded to a total of 176 requests for emergency medical services treating a total of 175 patients. There were 127 calls located west of the IHB Railroad and 32 calls east of the IHB Railroad. Year to date, there has been a total of 712 requests for service providing care to 715 patients.

This compares to last year (May 2014) when there were 140 requests for service with a year to date total of 634 service requests.

Training and Continuing Education:

May is an off month for EMT and Paramedic Continuing Education. Regular monthly Continuing Education will resume in July of 2015.

Firefighter/Paramedic Mike Peterson completed entry into the EMS System at Loyola at the Paramedic level. Mike recently completed Paramedic training through his full time employment and is now able to function at the Paramedic level here in LaGrange Park.

Special Activities:

May 1st – Department CPR Instructors conducted a CPR and AED recertification class for the medical staff at Webster Dental in LaGrange Park.

May 5th – Division Chief Ronovsky and Firefighter/Paramedic Carbone attended a joint EMS Chiefs and Coordinators meeting for the Loyola EMS System. This was held at the Riverside Fire Department.

May 8th - Firefighter/Paramedic Carbone attended the regular meeting of the EMS Region 8 Education Committee at Good Samaritan Hospital.

May 15th – Department members attended the annual Loyola EMS System Awards Breakfast in honor of National EMS Appreciation Week. Our Department was recognized by the EMS System for the care provided to a resident who was resuscitated after suffering a sudden cardiac event earlier this year.

May 16th – Department members provided ambulance and paramedic coverage for the Park District's Annual Run for the Roses Race through LaGrange Park.


May 20th – Firefighter/Paramedic Carbone attended a specialized training class with our Police Department at Plymouth Place to review challenges that the aging population face. We are working to provide this training to as many Police and Fire Department members in the future.







“NATIONAL EMERGENCY MEDICAL SERVICES WEEK”

May 17-23, 2015

- WHEREAS, Emergency Medical Services (EMS) is a vital public service; and


NOW, THEREFORE BE IT PROCLAIMED THAT:

May 17-23, 2015 is recognized as “National Emergency Medical Services Week”.


BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED THAT:
