

Village Revenue Sources & Uses




Village Expenditures – FY21






Central Area Storm Sewer Separation Project







Paramedic service in full operation

During the first three and a half months of service to the communities of LaGrange and LaGrange Park, the Mobile Intensive Care Unit (MICU), staffed by six paramedics, has responded to 41 calls requiring basic life support (BLS) which were handled by Emergency Medical Technicians (EMTs).

Last July, residents of LaGrange and LaGrange Park approved a maximum tax rate of 25 cents per \$100 assessed valuation to finance a 24-hour emergency ambulance service in both villages, which went into effect on January 1. The service, provided by Superior Ambulance Service of Elmhurst, operating out of the LaGrange fire station, is coordinated with the Community Memorial General Hospital Emergency Department telemetry base unit.

Armed with oxygen, ventilation-assist devices,

tracheal suction, portable defibrillator-monitor and a supply of cardiac drugs, paramedics on the scene of an emergency are prepared to meet the requests and orders of the hospital physician who directs the course of treatment for life support miles away from the emergency room.

The paramedics, who work in teams of two on a 24-hour basis, are: chief paramedic Barbara Pearson, David Laurich, Karen Bittner, Barbara Crean, Joseph Grandolfo and Mark Steck. Carol Karch, R.N., is the hospital Mobile Intensive Care coordinator and trauma nurse specialist and Police Chief Richard J. Savage is the LaGrange Park coordinator.
