

As requested for insertion into the Village Board meeting agenda packet, the following is a brief summary of Fire Department activity highlights for the month of July. As usual, a more comprehensive monthly report is kept within the department for your review.

EMS Incidents this month - 158. There have been 1070 YTD compared to 1012 YTD in 2022.  
Fire/Rescue Incidents this month - 54. There have been 324 YTD compared to 347 YTD in 2022.

Firefighters provided personnel provided pop-up splash pad events at Stone-Monroe and Robinhood Parks for Park District camp programs.

On July 4<sup>th</sup>, personnel attended to parades in Riverside, Brookfield and Lyons. We also participated in the Village of North Riverside 100-year anniversary parade, and several block parties.

Wednesday, July 26<sup>th</sup> was the last shift for Paramedic/Firefighter Sandy Gajeski. Several current employees and former contract paramedics she worked with came by to wish her well, and “clap” her out.

Staff continued to work throughout the month with PSI and conducting interviews to help improve paramedic staffing on our contract.

Fire sprinkler hydrostatic pressure testing took place for the new fire sprinkler system at Happier Now.

### **July was busy for the Fire Department with several incidents of Note**

***Tuesday, 7/04, 3:55 pm - A fatal car vs. motorcycle crash occurred at 26<sup>th</sup> and Maple.***

***Wednesday, 7/05, 6:32 pm - A significant house fire took place at 945 Meadowcrest when power lines came down, arcing and energizing portions of the home, hampering firefighters' efforts.***

***Saturday, 7/08, 5:53 am - Personnel successfully revived a 69-year-old male patient who was in cardiac arrest at a home in the 300 block of Malden.***

***Sunday, 7/09, 12:41 am – Engine 1221, Chief 1201 assisted Brookfield with a fire in a bedroom in an apartment in the 3600 block of Grand Ave.***

***Sunday, 7/09, 6:20 am - MABAS 10 Hazardous Materials Response Team personnel assisted Lyons with an ammonia leak at a cold storage facility on 47<sup>th</sup> St.***

***Wednesday, 7/12, 6:30 pm - Tornadoes moved through our area. Chief 1201 assisted with incidents in McCook including search of a heavily damaged motel.***

***Thursday, 7/20, 12:08 am – A single-vehicle rollover crash occurred on La Grange Rd. north of Scotdale causing heavy damage to the vehicle and guardrail.***



## EMERGENCY MEDICAL SERVICES ACTIVITY REPORT – JULY 2023

### Ambulance Responses:

This month EMT and Paramedic personnel responded to a total of 158 requests for emergency medical services treating a total of 153 patients. There were 127 calls located west of the IHB Railroad and 11 calls east of the IHB Railroad. We gave mutual 20 times and received it 13 times. Year to date there has been a total of 1070 requests for emergency medical services caring for a total of 1102 patients.

This compares to last year (July 2022) when there were 148 requests for a year to date total of 1012 requests.

### Special Activities:


