Re: Fire Department Activities – JUNE 2024

As requested for insertion into the Village Board meeting agenda packet, the following is a brief summary of Fire Department activity highlights for the month of June. As usual, a more comprehensive monthly report is kept within the department for your review.

EMS Incidents this month - 174. There have been 951 YTD compared to 912 YTD in 2023.
Fire/Rescue Incidents this month - 65. There have been 303 YTD compared to 270 YTD in 2023.

Our FD provided Engine and Ambulance coverage for the Pet Parade, and also participated in the parade.

Personnel went through required annual medical evaluations, in a mobile medical vehicle brought on-site.

Personnel participated in various training sessions at a vacant home and the vacant bank building during the month, including "First-in Officer" training with La Grange FD personnel.

Personnel provided CPR training to several seasonal Park District employees. Personnel conducted additional hose testing during the month.

Department Hazardous Materials Technicians participated in a Haz-Mat Incident Drill at the Mars-Wrigley Ice Cream facility in Burr Ridge. The training simulated an ammonia leak. Haz-Mat training also took place for new equipment the team secured, to flare off damaged pressurized propane cylinders and tanks.

Personnel briefly attended the Café Level Up rebranding anniversary event.

FD staff assisted with the Wounded Warrior Soldier Ride by displaying the American Flag at Brainard and 31st and cheering riders on at Woodlawn and Catherine.

Personnel attended various events held for the retirement for Allison Chorley, Building and Fire Specialist, who worked for the Village for over 40 years. We wish her well!

Staffed reviewed resumes for the part-time FD Administrative Assistant position, and interviewed five applicants.

Chief Maggos attended a County Emergency Management briefing with other staff and Village officials.

Ambulance 1214 and Chief Maggos were staged at a Chicago FD station during the Pride Parade, as Chicago requested assistance through the Mutual-Aid Box Alarm System.

Incidents of Interest

- *On Monday June 3rd at 9:05 pm, an Engine and Chief responded to an activated fire alarm at La Grange Hospital, which turned out to be a fire at the medical practice building across from the ER. We assisted with trying to locate the seat of the fire and removing smoke.*



EMERGENCY MEDICAL SERVICES ACTIVITY REPORT – JUNE 2024

Ambulance Responses:

This month, EMT and Paramedic personnel responded to a total of 174 requests for emergency medical services treating a total of 179 patients. There were 123 calls located west of the IHB Railroad and 27 calls east of the IHB Railroad. We gave mutual 24 times and received it 17 times. Year to date there has been a total of 951 requests for emergency medical services caring for a total of 962 patients.

This compares to last year (June 2023) when there were 151 requests for service treating 162 patients with year to date totals of 912 calls/949 patients.

Training and Continuing Education:

Probationary FF Emma Ellison enrolled in the Romeoville Fire Academy EMT-B summer program.

Special Activities:

FF/PM Matt Scott and FF/PM Jim Toff provided change of quarters coverage with ambulance 1215 to the Chicago Fire Department during the Pride parade on June 30th, 2024.

Activities of Note

Pillars 312 N. La Grange Rd: A walk-through inspection of the fire alarm revisions on 6/4/24 revealed the need to alter the initial drawings. Revised drawings were submitted by Detection Systems and Service on 6/27/24. (They were subsequently approved in-house on 7/2/24.)

St. Michaels Church: Forest Road School conducted a review of their emergency response plan. Under the plan, students are to evacuate to St. Michael's Church. St. Michael's contacted the bureau to determine if they have adequate capacity and exiting to accommodate up to 600 people. On 6/21/24 Captain Fagan took measurements of the interior and assessed emergency egress capacity. He will determine maximum capacity based on the fire code.

1 W Oak: On 6/5/24 the exterior sprinkler system bell was sounding. Upon investigation Capt. Fagan discovered that the sprinkler company was doing maintenance and had set off the exterior bell by turning off the water supply. Capt. Fagan also discovered that the Knox box keys didn't work. The property management company provided new keys on 6/17. The alarm system repairs are pending.
