President's Corner

As the leaves begin to fall from the trees and the days grow shorter and cooler, autumn is in full swing. This is the time each year when the Village reviews all that it has accomplished over the preceding months and begins to plan for the year to come.

Over the spring and summer, the Village completed several large infrastructure projects. The resurfacing of Edgewood Avenue from Ogden Avenue to Harding Avenue was completed. Phase IV of the Beach Avenue Project, which runs between 26th Street and 29th Street was also completed. Large scale pavement patches were installed on various streets such as Harding and Kemman to improve usability of the roadway and to extend their life. As many of you know, this past winter was extremely tough on our streets and as the Village prepares for the upcoming winter, maximizing available dollars for street maintenance and repair remains a top priority for the Village.



In addition to paving projects, the Village also completed the replacement of the water main running along Ogden Avenue between Park and Edgewood. This newly installed main will improve water flows for fire protection and reduce the frequency of main breaks and service interruptions.

This summer the Village welcomed a record number of new residents to our community. As the housing market continues to recover, building permits in the Village are on the rise and have reached record levels. This is good news for the Village. Not only is it evidence that existing residents are choosing to reinvest in their homes and stay in the


community, but also that La Grange Park continues to be a highly desirable community for new families. In an effort to welcome our newest residents and introduce them to the community, the Village has recently created a "New Resident Welcome Packet." This packet, filled with vital information on Village services, community organizations, local businesses, and more, is provided to all new residents. We hope it makes the transition to our community a great one.

This summer the Village also said goodbye to our Police Chief of over 18 years, Dan McCollum. A farewell reception honoring Chief McCollum was held prior to the July 22, 2014 Village Board meeting and a number of residents and community members came out to extend their gratitude for his years of service and to wish him well in his retirement. His commitment to the profession and dedication to the Village will be missed, but the department has been left in good hands. Deputy Police Chief Phil Kubisztal is serving as the Village's Interim Chief of Police until a replacement is named. The Village has hired GovHR USA, a local recruiting firm with national scope, to assist us in our search for a new Chief of Police. The recruitment process is currently underway and we anticipate it will be completed in late October or early November.

As you spend time this fall reflecting on all that you are thankful for and preparing for gatherings with family and friends, don't forget about the many community events that help us celebrate the season. Take advantage of the annual Community Clean-Up Day and E-Waste Recycling event that help you get your homes in order and ready for guests. Get extra use out of those Halloween costumes by participating in the La Grange Park Chamber Haunted Trolley Trick-or-Treat event. This December, join us for some hot chocolate and holiday caroling at the Village Tree Lighting ceremony or bring the entire family along to see Santa and more at the annual Holiday in the Park event. Village Opts Not to Renew Electrical Aggregation



But Residents Still Have Choices!

In Illinois you have choices when it comes to electricity supply, and you may be considering new options as the La Grange Park aggregation contract has ended. Once you receive the “Confirmation of Drop” notice from ComEd, you will have 60 days to choose an alternative electric supplier on your own or you will be required to remain with ComEd for a twelve month period. To search for an alternative supplier, visit the Citizen’s Utility Board website at www.citizensutilityboard.org or Google “CUB electric competition.”

If you remain with ComEd, they offer residential customers another rate option to fixed-price rates. If you are interested in taking more control of your electricity costs, the ComEd Residential Real-Time Pricing (RRTP) program could be a good choice for you. The ComEd RRTP program gives you the power to save on electricity with a rate that’s based on hourly, market electricity prices.

Customers who select the ComEd RRTP program pay the hourly, market price of electricity. That means you can manage your costs by shifting some of your electricity use (dishwasher, clothes dryer) to off-peak times when the price is lower, such as nights and weekends. With the RRTP program, you’ll get access to tools that make it easy to keep track of prices and monitor your electricity use. Individual cost savings are not guaranteed and will vary month to month based on weather, market conditions, and usage habits.

A team of RRTP specialists is available to answer questions and help you get the best possible value from hourly electricity pricing. If your average electric bill is more than \$40 per month, and you are able to shift some of your electricity use to lower priced hours this program might be a good choice for you. Summer Village Improvement Projects

The Edgewood Avenue Paving Project began in late May and was completed by mid-June. Nearly \$400,000 was spent for improvements. The scope of work for this project included repairs to minor sections of curb/gutter/sidewalks/driveways, sewer manhole reconstruction, pavement base repair and new asphalt overlay on Edgewood Avenue (from Ogden to Harding).

During the month of July and August, Beach Avenue from 26th to 29th was reconstructed by ALamp Concrete Contractors, Inc. for approximately \$260,000. The scope of the project included all new curb and gutter, rebuilding of sewer manholes, repairs to roadway base and a new asphalt wearing surface. Coincidental to the Beach Avenue project, Forest Road from 30th to 31st was ground and repaved. This project cost was absorbed within the project budgets for Beach and Edgewood.

Suburban General Construction installed a new 10” watermain line on Ogden Avenue, between Park and Edgewood Avenues in late August. This new watermain replaces an undersized line which had experienced multiple breaks over the past years. The total cost of the project was \$393,840.

Cook County Sheriff’s Police Vehicle Facility Relocation

The Village has become aware that the Cook County Board approved funding in the amount of \$850,000 to relocate the Sheriff’s Department of Vehicle Services from 10351 South Woodlawn in Chicago, to the County’s current Highway facility located at 901 West 26th Street in La Grange Park. According to the County, they plan to maintain the County’s fleet at this location from procurement through to road readiness. The Village met with representatives from the County to better understand potential impacts of this new use at the site. The Village has requested and is awaiting additional information regarding the County’s plans for this property. Residents with questions are encouraged to contact the County at: cookcountyil.gov. E-Waste Recycling Day

October 18th

As you prepare for Clean-Up Day, don't forget that old computer and electronic equipment! Get rid of it for free! Bring it down to the Village's Public Work's Facility, located at 937 Barnsdale Road, on Saturday, October 18th from 9 a.m. to 1 p.m. Representatives from Vintage Tech Recyclers, Village staff and community volunteers will be on hand to accept electronic items that (since January 2012) are banned from Illinois landfills. **Accepted Items** include: TVs, computers, monitors, printers, computer peripherals, scanners, fax machines, VCRs/DVD players, gaming systems, MP3 players and cameras. Vintage Tech utilizes hard-drive wiping and destruction that has been approved and validated in compliance to the R2 (Responsible Recycler) certification. Community Clean Up Day October 16th

Mark your calendars for the Village's annual Community Clean-Up Day, which will take place on October 16th. Single-family residences in La Grange Park will receive a one-time clean up service on the regularly scheduled collection day. Clean-Up Day cannot be rescheduled so don't miss out! (Four stickers in total will insure that all of the acceptable items placed on the curb will be picked up). If you choose not to participate, your trash will be handled as a regular pick up. Acceptable items must be placed next to your regular refuse on the curb by 6:00 a.m. Items other than furniture, large bulk items and appliances must be placed in bags, cans and/or boxes, not larger than 35 gallons or heavier than 50 pounds each. Stickers can be purchased at Village Hall for \$2.90 each.

Yard Waste is not included in the Clean-Up, but will be collected if properly prepared, stickered and set out on your regular collection day. If you would like to dispose of construction or demolition material, there are eight (8) refuse hauling companies licensed in the Village. Please call Village Hall at 354-0225 for a list of companies to contact for quotes for this service. For information on options for the disposal of Household Hazardous Waste, please contact the West Cook County Solid Waste Agency at (708) 453-9100. Unacceptable items will not be collected.

Prizes, including two bicycles, were given out in a free raffle.

Fire Prevention Week October 5th thru 11th

The La Grange Park Fire Department Urges Residents to "test your smoke alarm" during Fire Prevention Week, October 5-11, 2014! During this year's fire safety campaign, firefighters and safety advocates will be spreading the word that working smoke alarms save lives.

The La Grange Park Fire Department reminds you of these facts:

- In 2011, U.S. fire departments responded to 370,000 home structure fires. These fires caused 13,910 civilian injuries, and 2,520 civilian deaths, with \$6.9 billion in direct damage.
- Almost three of five (60%) of reported home fire deaths in 2007 to 2011 resulted from fires in homes with no smoke alarms, or no working smoke alarms.
- Working smoke alarms cut the risk of dying in half.
- When smoke alarms fail to operate, it is usually because batteries are missing, disconnected or dead. On November 2nd – change your clock, change your batteries!

BACK 2 SCHOOL TIPS

from the La Grange Park Police Department

The La Grange Park Police Department reminds everyone that schools are back in session and safety is everyone's responsibility. Please take a few moments and read the following safety reminders.



Walking and Biking to School

Even if you don't ride in a motor vehicle, you still have to protect yourself. Because of minimal supervision, young pedestrians face a wide variety of decision-making situations and dangers while walking to and from school. Here are a few basic safety tips to follow:

- Obey all traffic signals and/or the crossing guard -- never cross the street against a light, even if you don't see any traffic coming.
- Walk your bike through intersections.
- Walk with a buddy.
- Wear reflective material... it makes you more visible to street traffic.

Drivers – Always be ready to slow down in School Zones

Whether you are driving to work, or dropping a child off at school you will pass several children walking or riding their bikes to school. Many children are not taken to school by their parents. This means that they either walk or ride their bikes to school. La Grange Park uses Crossing Guards at various intersections to ensure that our children cross the busy intersections safely. To assure that children arrive safely at school, there are posted school zones where the speed limit is lowered from the original speed. This is where drivers need to pay better attention. The speed limit in school zones is 20 mph.

Drivers – Always be ready to stop for school buses

Whenever driving on any village street, regardless of the speed limit and the number of lanes, motorists traveling in both directions must stop when approaching a stopped school bus with its upper red lights flashing. A flashing stop arm will swing out while passengers are boarding or leaving the bus. (The only exception: on highways or roadways separated by a median, traffic coming from the opposite direction is not required to stop.) Once all passengers have boarded or exited, the STOP arm will fold away. Do not start moving until the red lights have stopped flashing and the bus begins to move.

Riding the Bus

School bus transportation is safe. In fact, buses are safer than cars! Remember these safety tips:

- Have a safe place to wait for your bus, away from traffic and the street.
- Stay away from the bus until it comes to a complete stop and the driver signals you to enter.
- When being dropped off, exit the bus and walk ten giant steps away from the bus. Keep a safe distance between you and the bus. Also, remember that the bus driver can see you best when you are back away from the bus.
- Use the handrail to enter and exit the bus.
- Be aware of the street traffic around you. Drivers are required to follow certain rules of the road concerning school buses, however, not all do. Protect yourself and watch out!

Riding in a Car

You might have heard before that most traffic crashes occur close to home... they do.

- Safety belts are the best form of protection passengers have in the event of a crash. They can lower your risk of injury by 45%.
- You are four times more likely to be seriously injured or killed if ejected from the vehicle in a crash.
- Everyone needs to be buckled up properly. That means older kids in seat belts, younger kids in booster seats and little kids in child safety seats.

Memorial Park Improvements

Residents may recall giving testimony in the fall, 2012 when the Park District conducted a series of master plan meetings. Now, two years later that work has brought in over \$500,000 in grant money, has seen the completion of the Beach-Oak Park Addition Project and is about to see ground breaking for the Memorial Park Improvement Project. Here is a brief status report for the Memorial Park project.

The first part of the two part project will replace the existing field house at 130 E. Oak with a family sized picnic shelter that is equipped with ecologically sensitive indoor restrooms and storage. The old field house, built in the 1950's will be demolished before the end of October and the new shelter building will ready for day camp programs and family picnic use in June of next year.

The second part of the Memorial Park Improvement Project features a new sand/water area and improved playground in the north part of the park, a bocce ball and bags court near the existing tennis courts, outdoor fitness equipment also near the tennis courts, plus a new gazebo and landscaping improvements in the southwest corner of the park. All these improvements are being scheduled to finish by the end of June, 2015.

Veteran's Memorial

On Saturday, September 20th the Park District held the Dedication Ceremony for the new La Grange Park Veterans Memorial, with over 500 residents and supporters in attendance. Residents still have an opportunity to add engraved bricks that honor a family member or friend veteran for years to come. Check out the Park District website at www.cpdg.org or call the Park District office at (708)354-4580 to receive an order form. Brick sales start at \$100. Bricks will be installed when there are twenty or more orders placed or at least once annually before Veterans Day. All money received for brick purchases will be kept in a dedicated Park District account for maintenance and future improvements.
