Re: Fire Department Activities – MAY 2025

As requested for insertion into the Village Board meeting agenda packet, the following is a brief summary of Fire Department activity highlights for the month of May. As usual, a more comprehensive monthly report is kept within the department for your review.

EMS Incidents this month - 183. There have been 906 YTD compared to 777 YTD in 2024.
Fire/Rescue Incidents this month - 73. There have been 288 YTD compared to 238 YTD in 2024.

Personnel participated in a LADSE career day event along with the La Grange Fire Department.

An environmental assessment was completed on-site at 1024 Newberry, to identify the mitigation required in order to obtain our Cook County Demolition Permit and IEPA fire training burn permit.

Personnel participated in specific Haz-Mat training this month in order to comply with new State Fire Marshal requirements to maintain their Haz-Mat Operations certification.

Staff assisted with conducting and evaluating a Park Jr. High fire drill.

Staff participated in MABAS 10 live fire training sessions. Chief Maggos, Deputy Chief Psenicka, and Captain Tullis assisted with instructing and safety at various sessions.

Personnel participated in the Barnsdale Road School Touch-a-Truck event, and also the Ready Teddy end of year picnic at the Park District Facility.

The Department provided EMS staffing for the Run for the Roses, and assisted with the Memorial Day ceremony at Memorial Park. .

Our four new Candidates graduated from the COD Fire Academy during the month.

Our ladder truck participated in the Pet Parade, with some staff and their children, while others staffed our station to assist with coverage.

Incidents of Interest

On Saturday May 17th at 4:20 pm, Chief 1201 and Truck 1219 responded to assist McCook with a significant structure fire involving the photovoltaic system and roof at the large Burke Beverage facility. Our truck and personnel fed and deployed a hose line to the roof, and Chief 1201 assisted with and operations.

On Thursday May 22nd at 9:46 am, we responded to assist Brookfield with a crash involving a school bus and small SUV. Several children were transported to areas hospitals, and our ambulance transported the SUV driver.

On Thursday May 29th at 2:31 am, we responded to a single vehicle crash in the 800 block of N. La Grange Rd. A vehicle hit a tree and landed on its' side, and firefighter had to extricate the driver through the front windshield.

EMERGENCY MEDICAL SERVICES ACTIVITY REPORT – May 2025

Ambulance Responses:

This month, EMT and Paramedic personnel responded to a total of 183 requests for emergency medical services treating a total of 181 patients. There were 148 calls located west of the IHB Railroad and 16 calls east of the IHB Railroad. We gave mutual 19 times and received it 22 times. Year to date there has been a total of 906 requests for emergency medical services caring for a total of 896 patients.

This compares to last year (May 2024) when there were 162 requests for service treating 174 patients and year to date totals were 777 requests for service treating 783 patients.

Training and Continuing Education:

All Paramedics and EMT's attended Loyola Ce on 5/13/2025 at 19:00 at Fire Station 1 and 5/12, 5/14, 5/16/2025 at Lagrange Fire Department.

Special Activities:

EMS Week was May 18 – 24. This is a national campaign that recognizes emergency medical services professionals. FD members attended a BBQ on Wednesday, May 21st at the LaGrange Hospital Ambulance ER bay and Thursday, May 22nd in the Hinsdale Ambulance ER bay.

The Fire Department provided EMS standby coverage for the Annual Run for the Roses on Sunday, May 18.
